Tactile, multi-sensory interpretations of Harper's iconic posters representing the featured habitats.

Woodland Forest Hide & Seek

Playful discovery game of hide & seek with different animals and insects found in the woods.

Ocean Races

Mechanical race through the ocean as different aquatic creatures navigating their environment.

Be Wild Movement Zone

Immersive interpretation of Harper's habitats with room to 'be wild' like your favorite creatures.

Art Studio

Engaging art making activities that emulate Harper's practice and minimal realistic style.

Changeable digital viewer featuring of the variety Harper's artworks throughout his career.

Stackable collection of the many versions of Harper's favorite insect, symbolic of luck and love.

Blackberry Jam

Lively table game of skill that feeds berries to the bears, inspired by the artwork of the same name.

Symmetrical Mirror Match

Colorful exploration of Harper's approach to representing nature through shape and pattern.

Curated collection of giclee prints representing the key pieces of Harper's body of work.
